
God Chose Aaron and his sons to be priests. He Chose others from the tribe of Levi to be helpers in the tabernacle.




A man named Korah was jealous because Aaron and his sons are priests and he was only a helper. He forgot that God chose Aaron.

Korah and his friends said to Moses you have not been a good leader. You brought us out of Egypt, where we had everything. Now you are making us wander around the desert.





No, they refused to go in.


Did Moses say they had to wander in the desert?

God said it because they disobeyed Him.

God was not pleased so he told Moses and Aaron to move away so that he could destroy all the people. But Moses and Aaron cried out, "Don't destroy all of them because of Korah's sin.




God answered their cry and did not kill all Israelites.



Moses went to the tents of Korah and his friends. God told the people to move away from the tents. The ground under the men split open and the earth swallowed them.




Even after all these the Israelites continue to grumble and accuse Moses and Aaron of killing the Lord's people. God became so angry He sent a plague. Many people became sick and died. Moses told Aaron to quickly make an offering for the sins of people before they all die. The plague stopped once Aaron made the offering.



Then God told each tribe to bring wooden staff to the tabernacle. The name of each tribe's leader was written on it. Aaron was from the tribe of Levi so his name was written on Levi's staff.



The next morning 11 of the staff were just dead but Aaron's staff has sprouted buds and flowers like a living tree.



The Rod of Aaron (Numbers 17:8)

"The rod of Aaron had sprouted, put forth buds, produced blossom and bore ripe almonds." This refers to St. Mary who gave birth to the Lord Jesus at a miraculous level.



Soon the people realized that God had chosen Aaron to be the high priest. God wanted the people to honor and obey their leaders. God told Moses to put Aaron's staff in front of the Ark as a reminder.




Years later the Israelites were still grumbling. They were tired of wandering around in the dry desert. They complained of nothing having enough water and were sick of eating manna every day.



Instead of being thankful that God had provided food, they complained about it. God heard their complaining and sent poisonous snakes into their camp. People were bitten and many died.




Then the people knew that God had heard their sinful words. They confessed their sin to Moses, Saying, We sinned when we spoke against the Lord and against you. Pray that the Lord will take the snakes away.



So Moses prayed to God. God told Moses to make a bronze snake and put it on a pole. God promised that everyone who looked at the bronze snake would be made well.



When Moses lifted up the bronze snake on the pole, people came from all over the camp. Some quickly; others were so weak they could barely crawl to a place where they could see the snake.





Just as God had said, all who believed Him and looked up at the snake were healed. They went away well and strong again, knowing that God had healed them.

Ask—Do you think everyone who had been poisoned by the snakes was healed?

Maybe Not...God said only those who believed Him and looked at the bronze snake would be healed. Some in the camp may not have believed God. People who refused to look at the bronze snake and trust God to heal them were not healed.


At last the Israelites were there! They could look across the Jordan river and see the land that God had promised to them so long ago.
