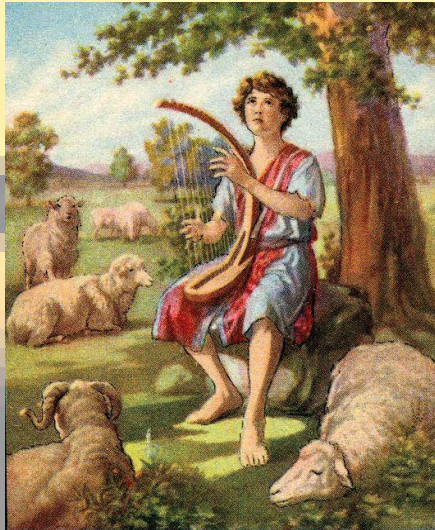

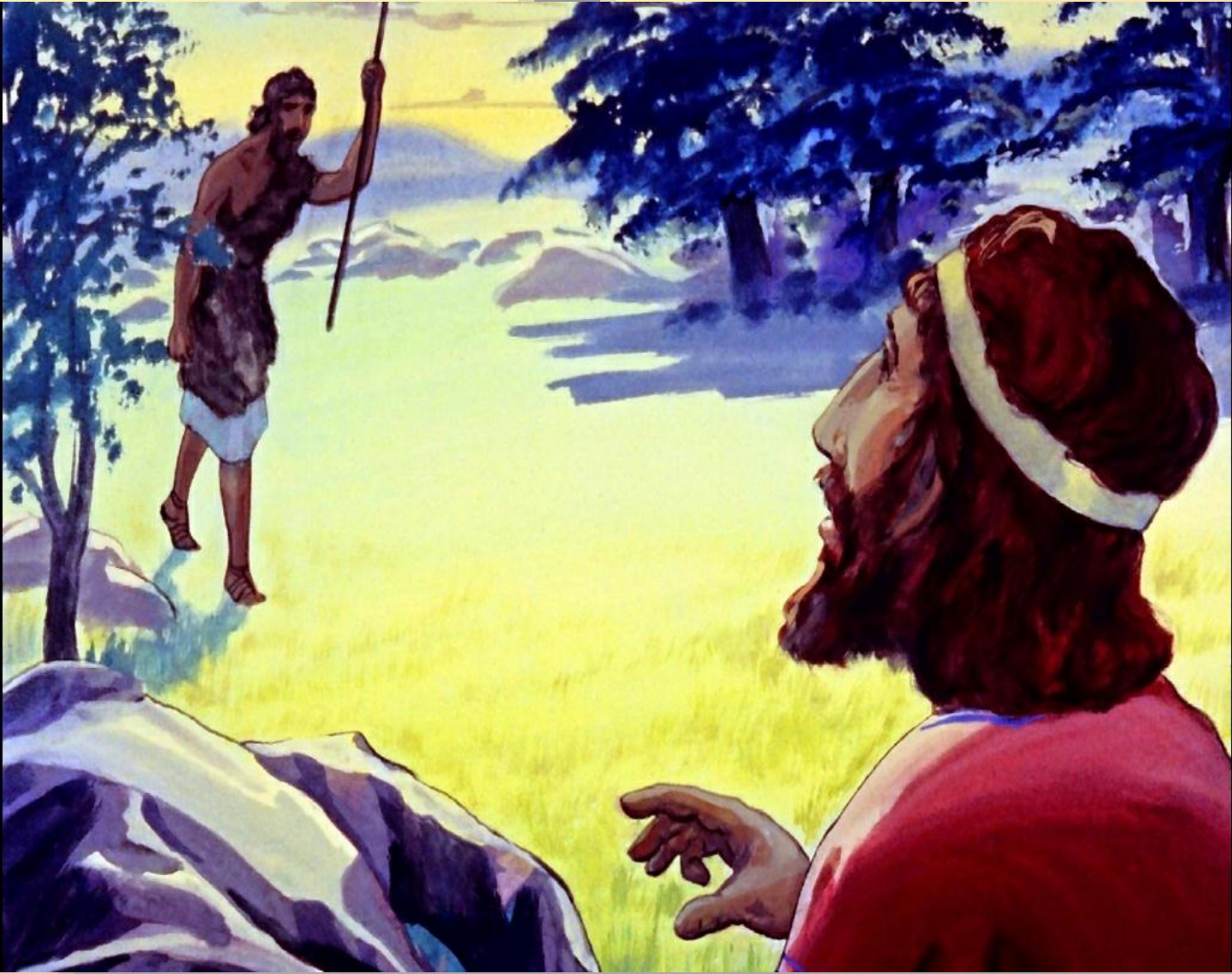

The people remembered what God had told them, and they went to find David.



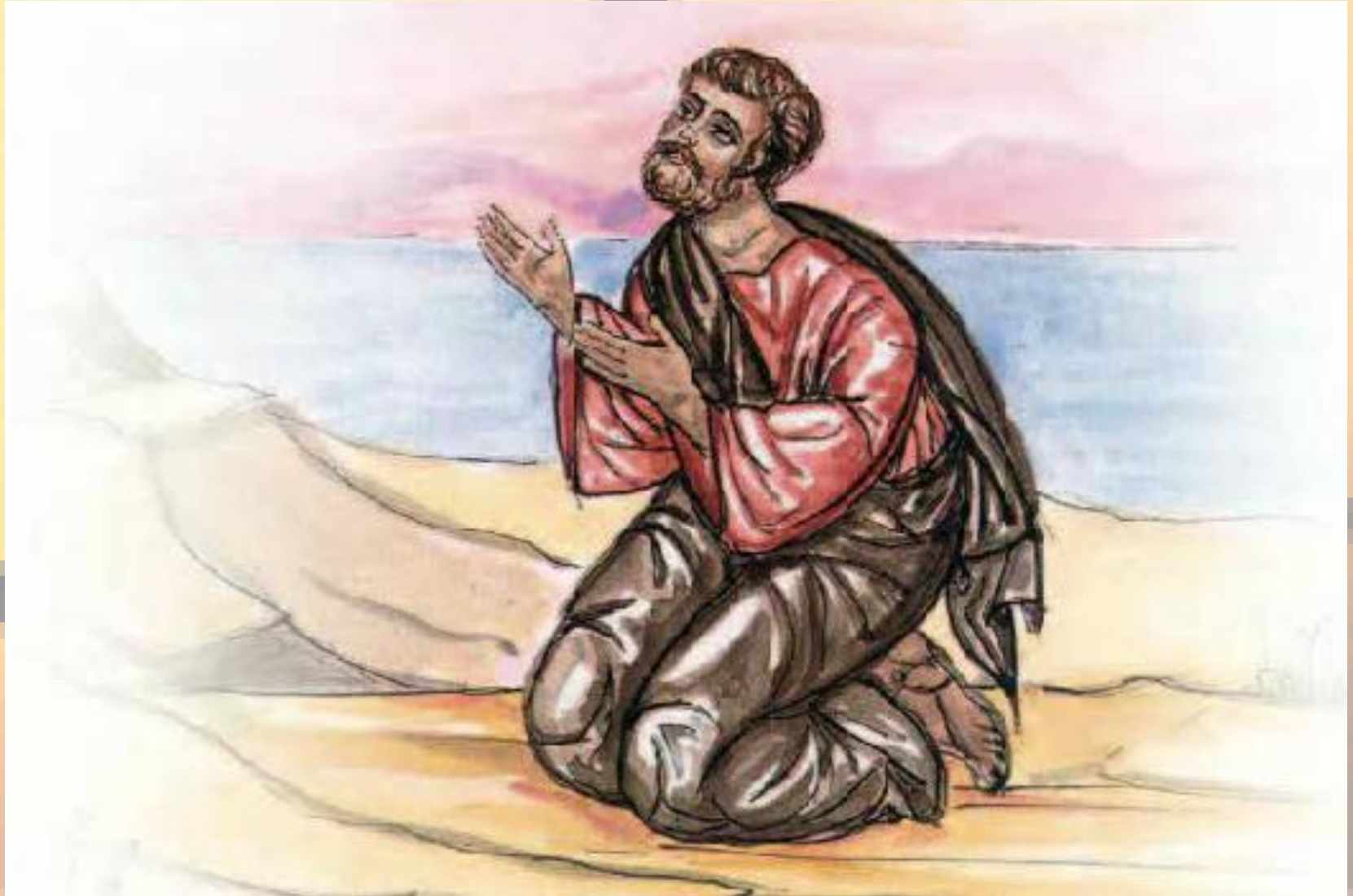
“David, you are now our King!” they exclaimed.
